

## Quarterly Student Public Reporting Requirement for (a) (1) Student Aid Portion and the CRRSAA (a) (4) and ARP (a) (4) program: Quarter ending 09/30/21

1. Mississippi Delta Community College acknowledges that, on April 22, 2020, it signed and returned the Recipient's Funding Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students under the CARES Act. Due to the signing this agreement, the College was not required to sign the Coronavirus Response and Relief Supplemental Appropriations Act (CRRSAA) Agreement. Under the terms of the Supplemental Grant Funds for Students Agreements, Mississippi Delta Community College agreed to be bound by the conditions set forth in each agreement by drawing down the grant funds.
2. Mississippi Delta Community College has received the following allocations from the Higher Education Emergency Relief Fund for emergency financial aid grants to students, totaling \$7,093,469:
  - a. HEERF I (CARES Act)     \$1,371,972
  - b. HEERF II (CRRSAA)     \$1,371,972
  - c. HEERF III (ARP Act)     \$4,349,525
3. As of September 30, 2021, Mississippi Delta Community College distributed \$2,665,112 in Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students. These funds were distributed to students through Bank Mobile by direct deposit or check.
4. The estimated total number of students at the institution eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section 18004(a) (1) of the CARES Act: Mississippi Delta Community College has 1444 students eligible to receive Title IV funding for the Spring & Summer terms.
5. The total number of students who have received Emergency Financial Aid Grants for the quarter ending September 30, 2021: 2795
6. Methods used to determine emergency aid grants:
  - a. Students completed an application for CRRSAA RISE grants which asked if they experienced a financial burden due to COVID from any of the following (they checked those that applied): Tuition, Food, Housing, Health care, and Child care. Summer & Fall Awards were allocated funds based on financial burden and COVID terms balance due.
  - b. Students completed an application for HEERF III grants. The HEERF III awards were allocated based on EFC and enrolled hours. Students were awarded \$75 per credit hour and an additional \$150 if the EFC was a zero.
  - c. Students were issued a CRRSAA flat award of \$208.69 in which no application was required.
7. Students were provided with instructions and guidance through several announcements using email, text message, and various social media outlets.
